WEEKLY MATHS TASKS (1 PER DAY)



Working on Times Table Rockstars - your child will have an individual login to access this

Solve this problem: Dan the detective looked for a number. He found a two-digit number less than 50. The sum of its digits was 12. Their difference was 4. What number did Dan find?

Challenge: Can you come up with one of your own?

Practice the 2, 4 and 8 times table. Do you notice any patterns that you might use to help you remember?

Convert time from a digital clock to an analogue clock.

Working on Numbots - your child will have an individual login to access this.



WEEKLY WRITING TASKS (1 PER DAY)

Watch newsround to find out about current events. Write a report about something you have been doing at home.

What was your favourite story when you were younger? Re write it for year 3 children.

Write a letter to a friend or family member.

Write a book report on a book you have read this week. Imaging you are trying to persuade others to read it (or discourage them!).

WEEKLY TOPIC TASKS (1 PER DAY)

Create a 3d model of your own dragon. Be imaginative with features and materials.

Design your own game and play it with the people in your house.

Make an information poster about Earth's natural disasters for a member of your family.

Practise colours in Spanish. Could you make a game or a song to help you learn an remember?

Learn to make something new in the kitchen. You might help make tea, or make a dessert for your family. Make sure you ask permission!

WEEKLY READING TASKS (1 PER DAY)

Read the blurb of a book. What questions do you have about the story before reading?

Share a story with your family. This could be a chapter book where you read and discuss a chapter a day.

Discover a new author and read one of their books. What type of books do they write?

Explore new vocabulary you find when reading. Create your own dictionary for new vocabulary, including definitions and the word written in a sentence.

Listen to a story on audible.
