

WEEKLY MATHS TASKS (1 PER DAY)

Working on Numbots - your child will have an individual login to access this.



Practise saying ordinal numbers: First, second, third, fourth etc Who was the 1st person to try and pull the turnip? the 4th? the 5th, the last?

Practise counting!

How many white geese in the story?
How many pot bellied pigs in the story?
How many yellow canaries in the story?

Go on a walk around the house and garden and find 5 things that are heavier than a turnip




Can you say the months of the year? What month is your birthday? What month is Christmas? Which 2 months are mentioned in the story?

WEEKLY LITERACY TASKS (1 PER DAY)

Listen to the story 'Gigantic Turnip' Can you join in with the repeated phrases? Tell your grown up which words rhyme

Listen to the story 'Gigantic Turnip' by Aleksei Tolstoy and Niamh Sharkey

Can you write a sentence to say what happened at the end of the story?



Can you draw a character from the story?



WEEKLY CREATIVE TASKS (1 PER DAY)

Use pencils or paint to create detailed observational picture of a vegetable



Have a go at designing and creating a seed packet

Have a go at printing with different fruits and vegetables – can you make a repeated pattern?



(IF POSSIBLE)

Grow your own seeds – cress seeds are a good one to try!



Can you find 5 things that you PULL in your house or garden? For example – you PULL up your trousers!



WEEKLY PHONICS TASKS (1 PER DAY)

Watch Mr Tumbles favourite nursery rhymes on youtube. Perform your favourite one to a family member.

Set 1 - for Spotty and Owlets is at 9.30 daily

Pick some objects from inside your house and go on a rhyming hunt to see if you can find anything that rhymes with the objects.

Practise saying your sounds using your Read Write Inc sound mat.



Put some objects from around the house on a tray and play 'I spy a..' sounding out the object and picking it up e.g 'I spy a c-u-p'.
