### WEEKLY MATHS TASKS (1 PER DAY)



Working on Numbots - your child will have an individual login to access this.

Practise using a stopwatch or timer. See how long you can balance on one leg or throw and catch a ball without dropping it. Ask your grown ups to do this too. Who has the longest time? Who has the shortest time? Can you try and beat your time?



Set a timer for a second. Is this quick? What could you do in a second?  
Now set a timer for a minute. How does this compare? What could you do in a minute?  
Now do the same again but for an hour.

Practise telling the time on an analogue clock and a digital clock.



Make your own clock using a paper plate, card or cardboard. Send your photos of your clocks to Miss Cooper and Mrs Jenkinson on twitter!

### WEEKLY TOPIC TASKS (1 PER DAY)



Go on a plant hunt in your garden, local park or woods. What plants can you find? Write a list, draw pictures or take photographs of your favourite ones. Are any plants as tall as a real beanstalk?

Plant your own beanstalk. Dried butterbeans work really well! Place it in a plastic cup with some damp cotton wool and watch carefully over the next few days of what happens!

Keep a beanstalk diary over the next couple of weeks. What is happening to your bean? Can you see any roots beginning to grow? Is there a tiny green stem starting to appear?

**SCIENCE TIME!** Can you change the colour of a white flower? <https://theimaginatortree.com/dyed-flowers-science-experiment/> What do you think will happen to the flowers? Do you think this will take a long time or a short time?



Research what a plant needs to grow. Make a poster explaining what a plant needs to grow.
