**EXPLORE IT:**  
Research

## WEEKLY TOPIC TASKS (1 PER DAY)

**Monday:** Create a poster to show different ways that you can reuse your plastic bags.

**Tuesday:** Look at some different ways artists have used recycled materials to create art.

**Wednesday:** How many sea creatures can you recognise from the book? Can you draw these?

**Thursday:** Can you create a collage or prints of animal colours and textures just like the story.

## WEEKLY ENGLISH TASKS (1 PER DAY)

**Monday –**  
Read aloud  
the story to  
an adult..

**Tuesday -** Write some sentences to show how the turtle would be feeling when it swallowed Stanley the plastic bag.

**Wednesday –** Create a poem about Stanley, or saving the planet. It could be a rhyming poem? Or an acrostic poem?

**Thursday –** How many words in the story can you find that begin with the letter S?

**Friday -**Write about how you would feel at each place the snail visited.
